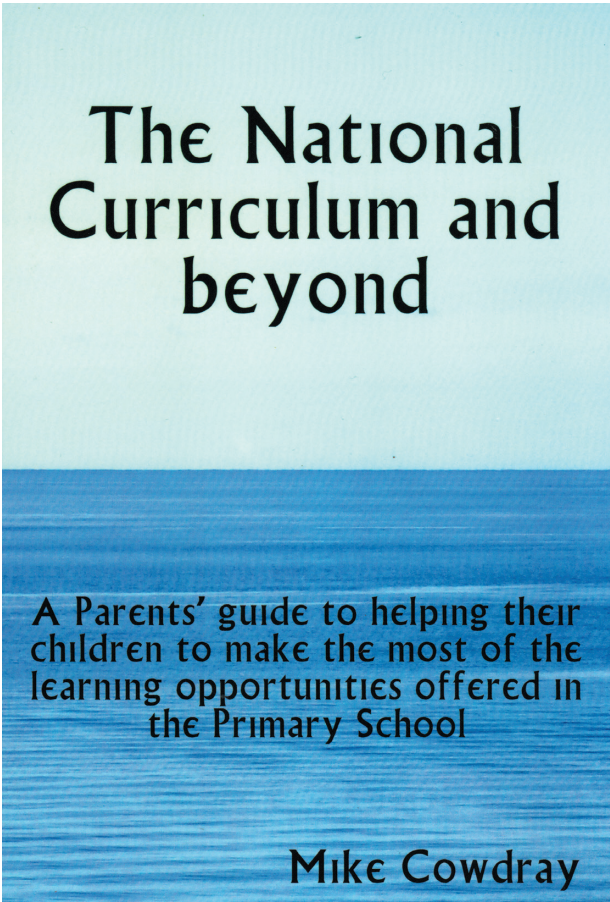




The National Curriculum and beyond
